As the semester winds down and crisp fall foliage gives way to snowy home football games, I cannot help but feel a sense of pride and hope with regard to where we stand as a newly re-founded Alpha. Resilience is one word that I think perfectly sums up our experience since the school year began. It was a period of growth, overcoming obstacles, and forging roles within the Alpha by learning how to play to our strengths.

For our re-founding class of 18 men, the biggest goal this semester was to recruit a solid pledge class and eventually fill the lodge in light of six graduating seniors. Initially, without any prior experience planning recruitment, this proved to be difficult. During the middle of the semester, shifting our strategy from extensively planned formal rush events to a series of casual hangouts and activities was extremely beneficial in two ways. It allowed us to develop authentic friendships with potential new members over the course of the rush process, and in turn, allowed them to better evaluate their personal fit within the friend group. In the end, we're proud to say that we signed a pledge class of six outstanding gentlemen that exemplify the ideals of Chi Psi. Weekly Pledge Education meetings began in full force in early November, with the aim of completion by mid-December in

preparation for a January initiation.

In addition to the rush efforts, significant progress was made this semester on the philanthropy, service, and Brotherhood fronts. Actives planned a "Haunted Lodge" fundraiser on Halloween weekend, set up in a typical haunted house format complete with decorations, a fictional murder mystery centered around Lodge history, and jump scares. It's a goal of ours to make this an annual tradition, incrementally improving all facets each year. Our service partnership with Natural Area Preservation of Ann Arbor forged last year has been going strong, with park cleanup workdays occurring frequently. Between busy Football Saturdays and the grind of the academic calendar, actives, and pledges went on a fall Brotherhood retreat to a Northern Michigan cabin in early November. This was a fantastic opportunity for the group to get closer on a much-needed break, featuring fishing, target practice, and plenty of euchre around the fireplace. Brothers and pledges also bonded through participation in several intramural leagues over the course of the fall. Our IM flag football team performed especially well, securing a top 4 finish in the fraternity league.

With the next calendar year quickly approaching, the winds of change will descend upon the Lodge, resulting in many firsts and lasts. We are currently in the process of nominating and voting on our next executive board. This passing of the torch is equally


While waiting in the lobby outside, the anticipation amongst the re-founders was palpable; we all knew that the future of our Alpha was riding on only a few minutes of talking.

### "The Haunted Lodge" Raises Funds to Support Local Youth Safety Programs

On October 27, Alpha Epsilon hosted its inaugural Haunted Lodge to raise money for the Washtenaw Council for Children. In one night, we raised over \$1000 to support their efforts to directly counteract neglect and child abuse across the county. We are



thrilled to have had such a successful first philanthropy event since refounding and greatly appreciate the generosity of everyone who donated time, decorations, and money towards the evening.

When planning this event, we had two primary goals in mind. Firstly, we wanted to raise a significant donation for an organization doing important work in the Ann Arbor or Washtenaw County area. Secondly, we sought to design an event that brought in our fellow students and showed them what Chi Psi is really about. So, when someone mentioned the prospect of hosting a haunted house targeting students out for Halloweekend festivities, the brothers immediately rallied behind the idea.
